Year 3- When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?

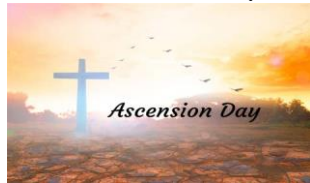
Year 4 - What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?

Ascension Thursday, May 10, 2018
Ascension Day is the 40th day of Easter and commemorates Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven, according to Christian belief.

Pentecost Sunday, May 20, 2018

The Christian holiday of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles. Some Christians believe this event represents the birth of the Catholic Church.
