Isolation dates for fully vaccinated people and children under age requirements for vaccine now need to self-isolate for 5 days (day 1 being the first day after a positive LFT result) and once two NEGATIVE LFT results have been attained 24hrs apart you may return to your educational setting, or on day 11.

06/01/2022 IMPORTANT UPDATE:

Confirmatory PCR tests following a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result are to be temporarily suspended from Tuesday 11 January. This will mean that anyone who receives a positive LFD test result will be required to self-isolate immediately and will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.
