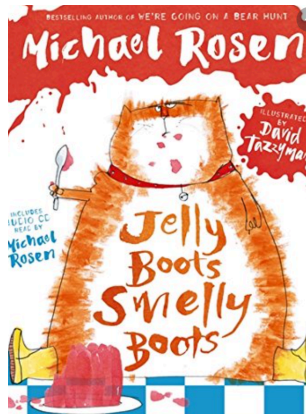


Imagine Poetry - October 2020

you hammer them in a bit to make them short.

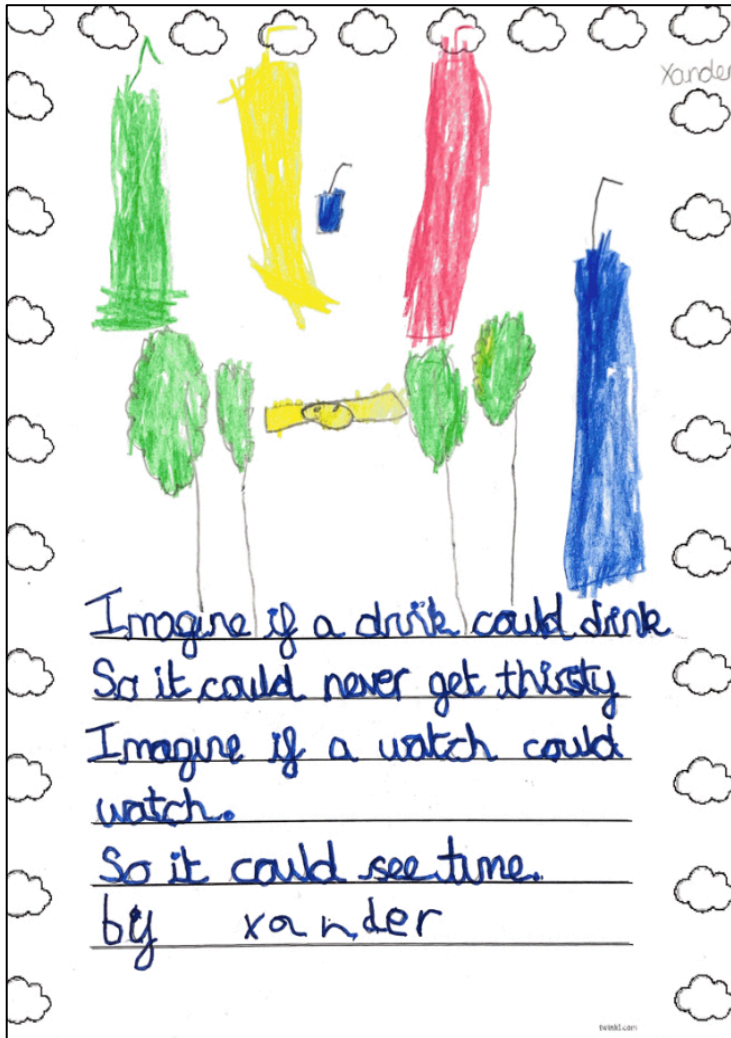
Imagine if your sink stinks

you can see the painting painting itself.

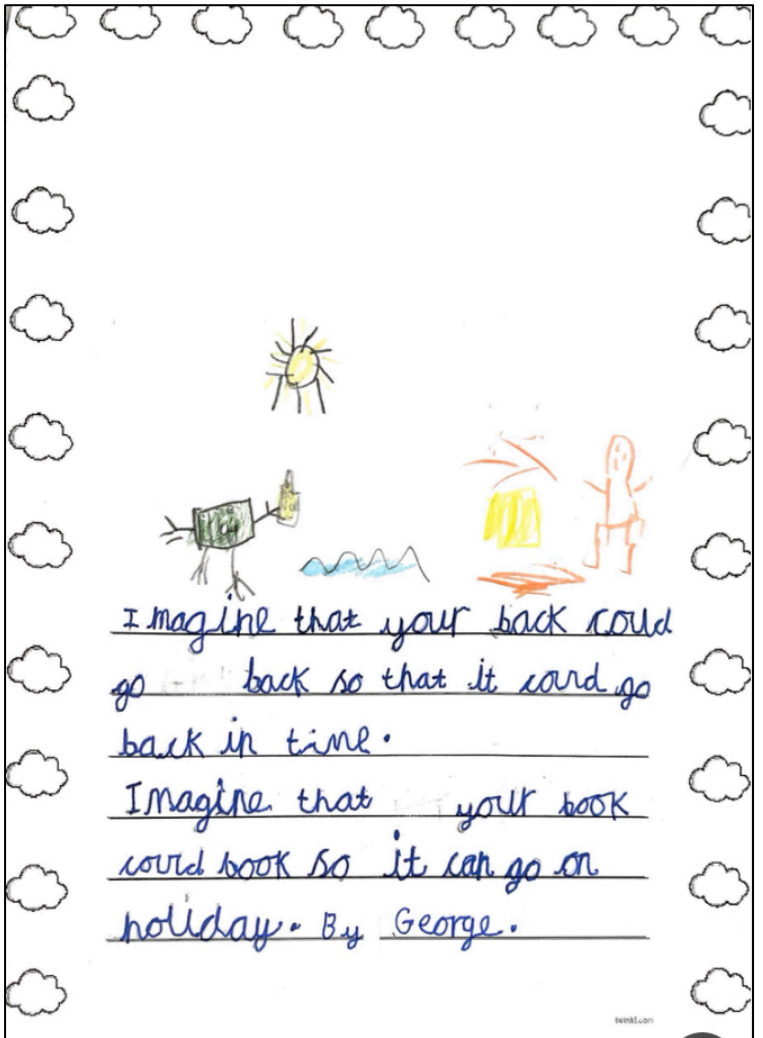
Imagine if a letter is a letter

all you can see are famous people from the movies.

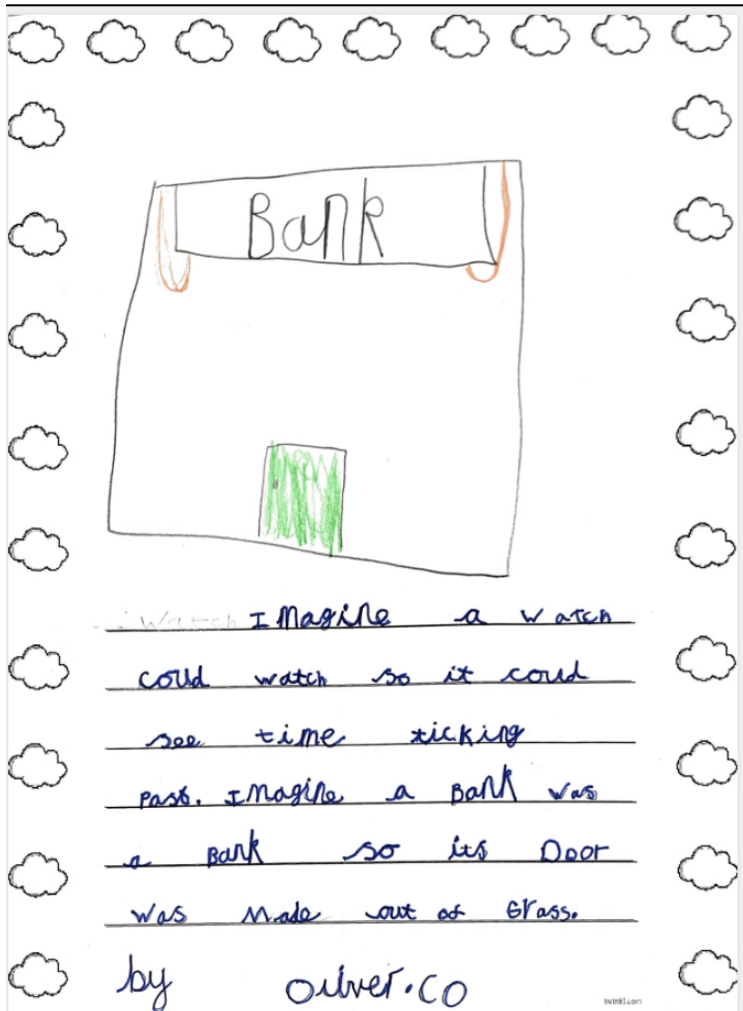
We were so inspired that we wrote our own 'Imagine' poems using homographs and homophones, check out our published poems:



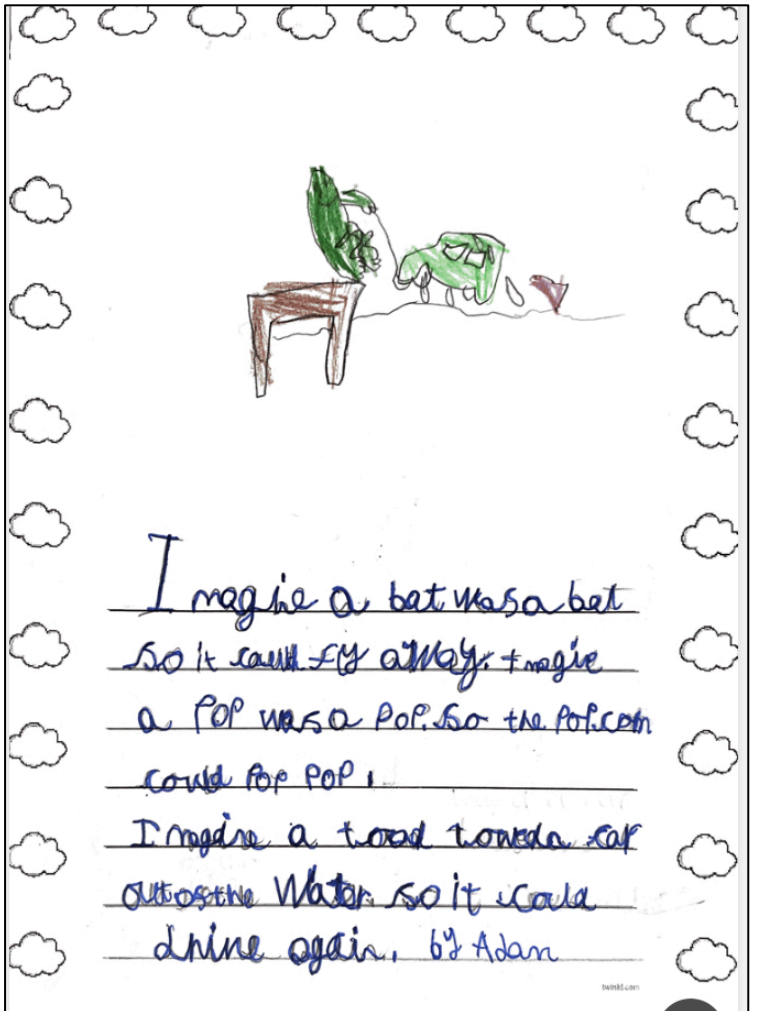
Imagine if a drink could drink
