continue until we return in September, or something that has inspired them. We are then putting them around our very own St George's dragon at our school entrance to show our appreciation. There has been a primary school in Wrotham since

1870. The original school was sited along the Gravesend Road, and forged close links with the parish church. Over the years the school out-grew its Victorian building. Eventually, the school made the 'big move' across the village to the present building on 15th September 1970. We are making plans in school to help the children celebrate this occasion (while working within the government guidelines!) as well as learning about the history of the school they are part of. Their hope (our school value this term) is they have inspired the younger children in school to take over this project when they leave - and I am sure they will!
