<b>Barriers to</b>	learning for	PP pupils:
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1. Children joining the school with low entry levels in language and communication.

- 2. Engaging parents who may be reticent to work with the school and other internal/external agencies.
- 3. Pupil motivation to learn due to low emotional wellbeing, behaviour, learning styles and limited life experiences.
- 4. Families receiving support from Early help and other agencies may have challenging attendance patterns.

## Agreed Priorities arising from the PP strategy review 2017/2018:

1. Find out how best to accelerate the progress of our 'disadvantaged' pupils.

2. Scrutinise further the link between SEN & disadvantage and ensure that money being spent on specialist learning support & interventions is well targeted.

3. Recognise that some children and families may require a combination of strategies to have an impact on attainment.

4. Support vulnerable families with lower attendance and lower % of attendance of PAs
