## RE topics for this term

In our RE studies this term, we draw out the links or Golden Threads which join different religions. The children are becoming confident to make those links and talk about what believers and non-believers have in common.

Year 1 - Religion: Judaism; Who is Jewish and what do they believe?

**Year 3** - Religion: Christianity; Concept: Kingdom of God; When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?

**Year 4** – Religion: Hindu Dharma; Why do some people think that life is a journey and what significant experiences mark this?

Year 5 - Islam - What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?

**Year 6** – Religion: Universal; What can be done to reduce racism? Can religion help?
