**Year 4** - Religion: Hindu Dharma; Why do some people think that life is a journey and what significant experiences mark this?

**Year 5** - Islam - What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?

**Year 6** - Religion: Universal What can be done to reduce racism? Can religion help?
