

We were delighted to welcome Tim and the 'Open the Book' team back to a monthly Worship. We are also pleased to see Edward back in school for Worship on Monday.




Year R Bible Service

Year 1 - Why does Christmas matter to Christians? (core learning)




Year 3 - What is important for Sikh people? (+ Christmas themed lesson)
