George was thought to have been born in what is now known as Turkey. He lived his young life as a Roman Solider in Palestine where he was charged to keep the Christians in order. Soon he decided that the way in which the Christians were being treated was unfair and unjust and he bravely decided to stand up against their persecution.

George is believed to have lived near a small town Lydda, which is now called Lod, in Israel. In Roman times Lydda was very different from today. The Romans soldiers were very worried about the Christians and they felt vulnerable from attack. It was their aim to pick on' (repress and persecute) the Christians whenever they could.

George was a kind man and when he saw how the Romans treated the Christians he felt angry. He soon began to believe that this wasn't the way to treat human beings. What he did next put his life in danger.

Aeneas and Dorcas

As Peter travelled about the country, he went to visit the Lord's people who lived in Lydda. ³³ There he found a man named Aeneas, who was paralyzed and had been bedridden for eight years. ³⁴ "Aeneas," Peter said to him, "Jesus Christ heals you. Get up and roll up your mat." Immediately Aeneas got up. ³⁵ All those who lived in Lydda and Sharon saw him and turned to the Lord.

In the bible it is known that it was at Lydda that Peter perform a miracle. Upon seeing a man who had been ill for eight years Peter told him to rise up and walk.

It is possible that George had seen this miracle or certainly heard about it and this story would have soon spread around?

George would have been very impressed by the faith of those who died believing in Jesus that he became a Christian himself, even though he knew that this would mean certain death

As a follower of Jesus, this is the sort of power of which St. George would have approved and for which he would want to be remembered as a saint

Is this the true story of St. George?



Peter was the spokesman for the disciples during the life of Jesus. He often spoke up honestly when others were afraid. After the death of Jesus, Peter was desperate to carry on his good work. He soon became known as **Peter the Healer** and those sick or in terrible need welcomed his presence. Once George became a Christian he entered a new life which finally resulted in his death. In Lydda his life was celebrated and it was here that he was finally laid to rest.

Soon George's name was known far and wide as someone who stood up against the misuse of power

In fact St. George is very highly regarded by many in this part of the world including Muslims.

George is one the most popular boys' names. It seems that it was Richard the Lionheart from England who decided to adopt George as our English saint in the time of the crusades, probably because he too was impressed by the military might of this hero

King Richard was a devout Christian he was determined to lead his knights to capture Jerusalem.
