Clothing Requirements

PE days: The children may wear their school PE kit for the day – the requirements are navy shorts, house coloured t-shirt, school jumper/cardigan or fleece. Over the top they may wear black plain tracksuit bottoms. Hair must be tied back, no jewelry to be worn.

Swimming: Children wear school uniform to school. In a suitable bag they need to bring a full piece swimming costume or trunks, swimming goggles, swimming hat and towel.

Forest schools: Can wear own choice but must be long trousers and long sleeved t-shirt, closed outdoor shoes such as walking boots or wellingtons. Bring in a pair of trainers for inside the school building. Additional layers if the weather is colder. Waterproof coat and over trousers recommended (these are provided from Year R and 1)
