TECHNOLOGICAL SUPPORT

Last week we spent a long time supporting families to get you all online for your remote learning, Class Dojo and Zoom have been the main ways you can effectively access your child's class learning on a daily basis.

Last Friday Mr Jones held a Class Dojo surgery for questions and Ms Chin a Zoom Surgery for people with questions. Thank you to those of you that phoned in as I know how helpful you found this support. Should you have missed them please call the school to we can get someone to support you.

Ensuring every child can access remote education remains a priority shared by Government, the County Council, and schools. The DfE is working with mobile network operators to help schools support disadvantaged pupils in years 3 to 11 who rely on a mobile internet connection. Disadvantaged families may be able to benefit from free increases to their mobile data. Schools can request these free mobile data increases for families during the spring and summer 2021 terms here. PRIMARY ASSESSMENTS UPDATE

In another U-turn the Government has now officially cancelled all statutory assessments from Year 1 to 6. This includes the Year 1 phonics screening, Year 4 Maths Times Tables Test as well as the Year 2 and 6 SATs. We are still awaiting a response regarding the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile. However, please can I make this clear that although statutory reporting has been scrapped, schools are STILL EXPECTED TO DO INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS so the announcement makes no difference to the assessments our teachers would do. I must stress that teachers can only make their assessments based on the work the children are completing remotely. Therefore, completing work on a daily basis and attending the zoom is very important.
