

### **Teachers strike**

As I'm sure you are aware, the National Education Union (NEU) have voted to strike after balloting their members. This is in relation to disputes over school funding, recruitment, pay and conditions. Strikes are scheduled for the following dates: **Wednesday 1st February, Thursday 2nd March, Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March**.

I am in consultation with Governors and school leaders to assess the affect the strike may have on our school. The NEU is hoping the Government will enter into negotiations in order to avoid industrial action. If strikes go ahead, we may need to adjust operations for these days but we will be fully open to pupils on Wednesday 1st February. Arrangements for March will be considered nearer the time and in the hope that they won't be required, however again we would again adjust plans to keep the school open. Thank you for your patience as we make plans and for your comments of support.

#### Reminders!
