### Safeguarding

As we return to the school commute, may we take this opportunity to thank you for the safe parking around the community. This is paramount for the safety of our children and all adults!

Just to remind you to:

- Single-park only - park considerately, let traffic flow and do not park in restricted areas.
- Switch off your engine while you are waiting.
- Park and Stride - consider parking further away and benefitting from a short daily walk!

As a school we believe that safeguarding is not only about protecting children and young people from abuse and neglect but also their families too. It is our intention therefore to support families by signposting them to universal services which may assist families when they are facing difficulties themselves.
