**100% Badges and Certificates** were handed out for term 3 attendance – well-done to **51%** of our children who achieved this! This means they were in school EVERY day through term 3 - this is a fantastic achievement!

We also had **60%** of our school meeting our 96%+ target in term 3.

Stand out class of the term was **CEDAR** class with **20** of the children having **100%** attendance and **23** in total over **96%**, WOW!

ATTENDANCE MATTERS and was an area highlighted on our Ofsted report to improve. "Some pupils do not attend school regularly enough, despite leaders' efforts to reduce persistent absence. These pupils miss vital learning."

Those with attendance below 90% are classed as 'persistent absence'. Parents are asked to work with the school by attending meetings with the Headteacher so we can evidence school and home working together. This supports parents when the school receives our visit with the Educational Welfare Officer (EWO) and they discuss our PAs.

➤ Reporting an illness – please call the school office on 01732 882401 before 9.30am if your child is unwell and unable to attend school. Please also advise the school office of any medical appointments prior to their date
