## **VISION & LEADERSHIP**

As Headteacher of a primary school you spend a lot of time developing your improvement ideas and designing curriculum plans but the reason behind this is to drive the vision for your school. It is more than just academic achievement. At St. George's we strive for every child to reach their full potential, be inquisitive, develop awareness of the world around them and have compassion for others but this can only be done through a journey that supports every child to being a lifelong learner.

One area of this journey, I believe, is vital for every child at St George's is for them to have the opportunity to be leaders. In Covid-19 times pupil voice is as important as ever but we are having to be creative in the ways we can now do this.

This week we are introducing Class Ambassadors in every class. Each day a child becomes the Class Ambassador. #### **Importance of Outdoor Learning at Forest Schools**

Last week was a great way to share the importance of hands on learning. Cedar Class (Year 3) have been enjoying the book 'The Boy With The Bronze Axe' which they used to learn more about the Stone Age. I was then invited to see their 'hands on' learning about Skara Brae and hear their knowledge of facts and information come pouring out after having a stone age day with Mark from Forest Schools. In their 'tribes' the children built their own stone age homes, created stone age weapons, learnt why they were used, understood how fire was made and made chalk paintings.... I think they enjoyed it and their knowledge was incredible!

While Year 3 enjoyed a hot day this was a complete contrast to Year 6 Forest school's day! By the time the children get to

Year 6 they have developed excellent independence and understanding of how to use tools correctly and for the right purpose. They have been lucky enough to have some of their forest school sessions on the Wild Times Forest School site itself where they will be able to develop independence and responsibility as well as learn life skills in an outside environment.
