Be smart @ internet

S SAFE Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information. It won't be your full name, email address, phone number, house address, photos or school name - to people you are chatting with online.

M MEETING Meeting someone you know in person or talk with online can be dangerous. Don't do so with your parents' or carer's permission and never meet only when they can be present.

A ACCEPTING Don't accept or click on links or download files from people you don't know. If you do, tell a trusted adult.

P RELIABLE Remember you have on the internet may not be true, so always check any site you visit when you are.

T TELL Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone is bothering you online. Don't use a laptop or phone if you are in a public place or someone you don't know is nearby. Tell them.
