Parent Forum Discussion –

Term 1 2019 Report

School Priorities for academic year 2019-20

1. Attendance

End of last academic year our whole school attendance was 95.9% - lowest 20% of all school's nationally. The expectation is to be above 97%.

Action:

- **Now at Governing Body level.**

2. Academic results

Need to focus on key areas which can be supported through homework which focuses on daily reading, phonics/spelling to support English teaching and times tables and mathematics for Maths.

Action:

- **Parents to know these areas are the homework expectations for the school to support their child's learning**

3. Curriculum Development

We have been redesigning our curriculum and started to make changes from summer term last academic year. We want the intent of our curriculum on offer to engage our children, make the most of our school and the surrounding area to stimulate learning. Purple Mash is our new computing platform but allows the children access at home to complete tasks that may have come up in class they want to explore or do some research or support their homework areas.

Action:

- **School will offer a come and learn computing session with the children's class**
- **School to put on a Purple Mash session for parents**

Further discussion:

1. Boys Clubs Year 3 and 4 – not enough free ones on offer?
All clubs run by staff are voluntary and we try as far as we can to be as fair as we can.
2. Online payments for breakfast club and school dinners?
These are under review at relevant levels and as a school we are making a move towards being a cashless school but are mindful of all our families in school as this may not suit all currently.
3. Purple Mash – can hard copies of work be given?
Purple Mash is a new system which we are all getting to know and use to supplement pupil engagement in learning. Class teachers are sending home information all the time when raised at teacher level and discussed as a staff and responded to as a teaching staff to all classes. 4. Earlier breakfast club and offer of after school care?
This has been raised a couple of parents looking into the logistics of a company running this. Responses of interest in paying for this would be useful to find out if there is enough interest. This would not be run by the school and would involve payment to the provider.
