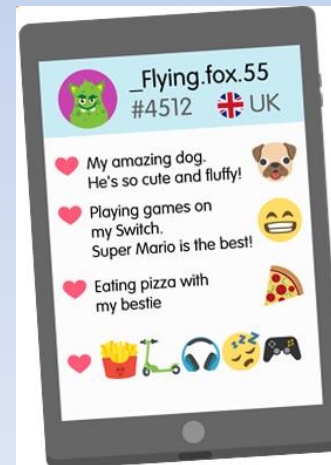


1) In our assembly on Tuesday, we realised that we use the internet in lots of different ways, including our online identity

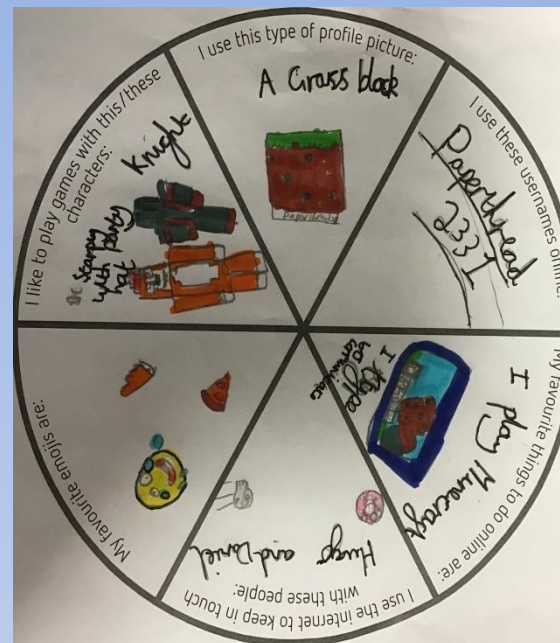
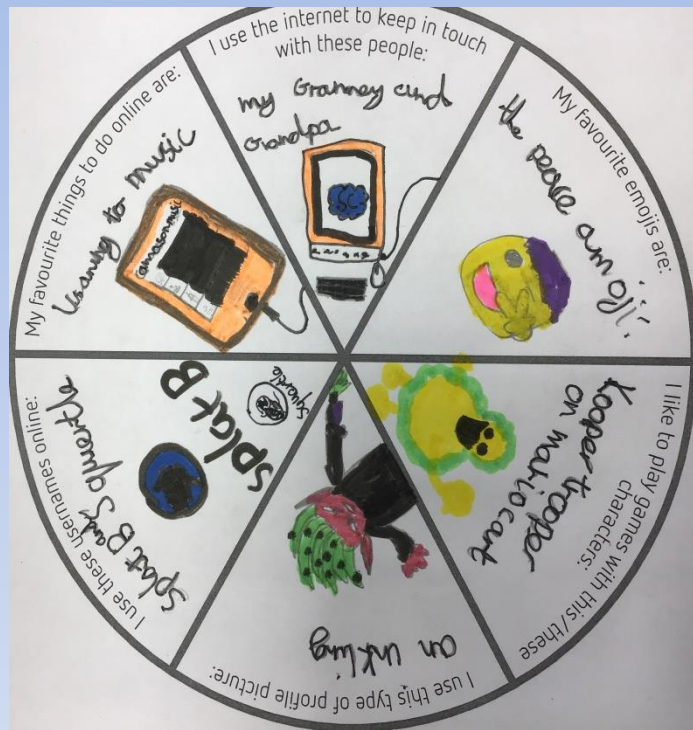
In Willow Class...
