Each class completed some activities linked to the idea of peace and visited the stations in the Quiet Garden.

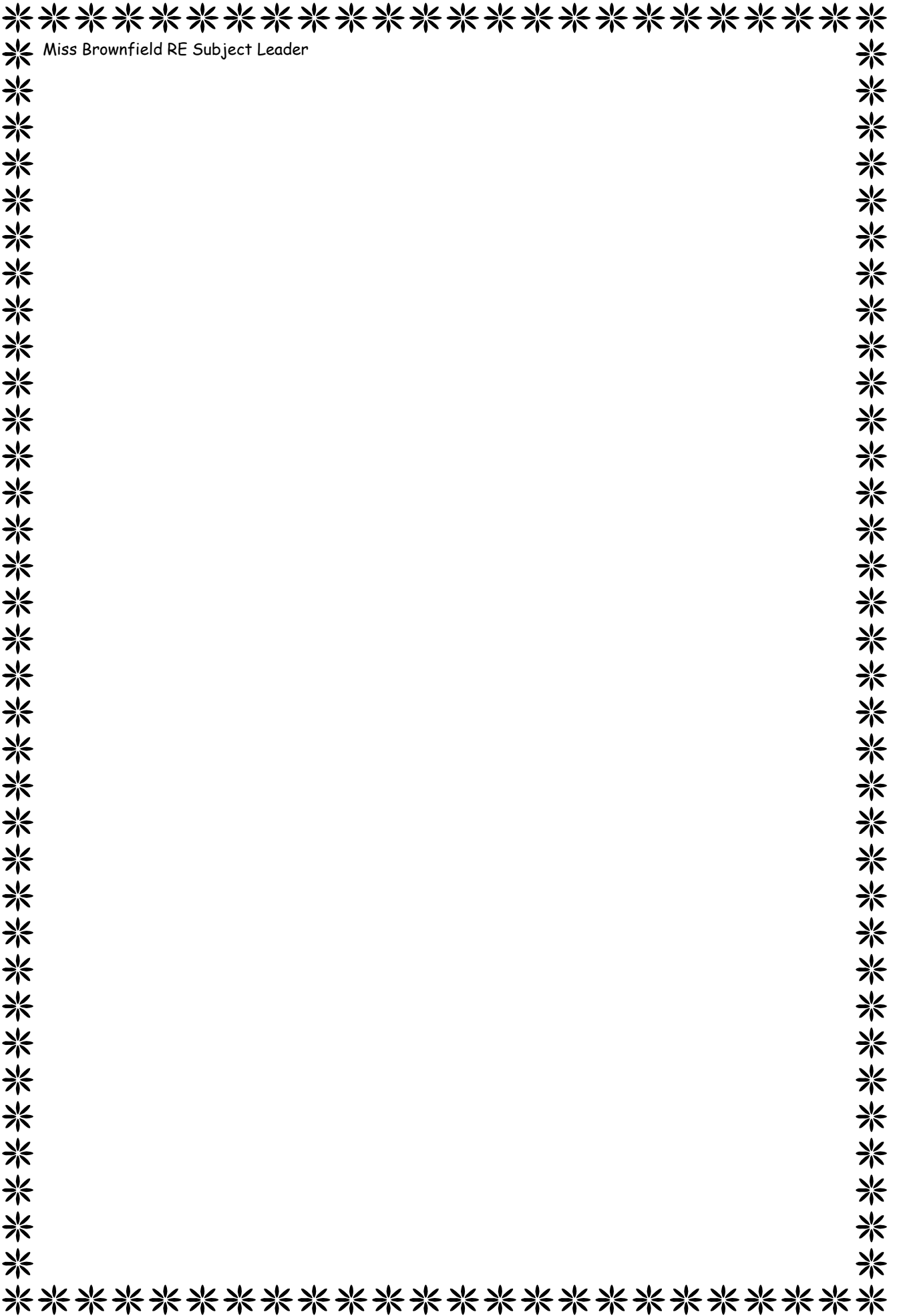
Christmas
